Title: *All Aboard! Now Boarding the Grand Jury Train!*

Description: Kevin Maricle will present an overview of what a Maricopa County grand jury does, how it works, and the quirks about the grand jury process that affect court reporters. There will also be a mock grand jury presentation with a Phoenix police officer as a witness and a discussion on the revelation that reporting grand jury cases is less mysterious, more interesting, and easier than you might think! Adam Gage will give insight to the grand jury process from a court reporter's perspective and share steno briefs related to grand jury proceedings.

Short Bios: Adam Gage, RPR, CCR (TN), was born in California and raised in New York and has lived many places in between. Adam went to court reporting school in San Diego and Texas. He started reporting as a freelance and circuit court reporter in LA (Lower Alabama) and Tennessee. He came to Yuma in the early 80's with the Marine Corps. When a position opened up in the courthouse in Yuma he returned and has been here since 1999, working first as the presiding judge's court reporter and the supervising court reporter for the last ten years.

Kevin Maricle. After graduating from ASU School of Law, attorney Kevin Maricle worked in Washington, D.C. at the Library of Congress. She then returned to Arizona looking for jury trial work and joined the Maricopa County Attorney's Office Criminal Division. As a deputy Maricopa County attorney, her career has included criminal jury trials, Arizona Court of Appeals and Supreme Court appellate work, and training county attorneys. She now presents criminal cases daily to the nine Maricopa County grand juries currently operating in the county.

Title: *ERIC Program - Feel like you are always putting out fires? Hear what it's like to be on a team who does just that!*

Description: The Arizona Emergency Response Interpreter Credentialing Program (ERIC) ensures the Deaf and hard-of-hearing community have access to critical safety information during the fire and flood season throughout the state of Arizona. Vicki and Karla will explain how the program got started, what is expected of the CART captioners certified through the program, as well as share their experiences of being in the different “fire camps” throughout the 2017 fire season.

Short Bios: Karla Martin is a CART captioner for the Deaf and hard-of-hearing. Karla graduated a President's Scholar from Southern Illinois University where she obtained a Bachelor's of Music and Certificate in Court Reporting. She also took graduate business courses at Arizona State University. She is an RPR and a CSR/CR in five states, including Arizona. She has over 35 years' court reporting experience and over 20 years' CART captioning work experience. She provides CART captioning onsite and remotely for the classroom, the courtroom, for conventions, at state agencies, and live theater. She is a member of Cohort 1 of the Emergency Response Interpreter Credentialing (ERIC) program.

Vicki Bond is the community outreach coordinator in the public information office, Arizona Department of Emergency & Military Affairs. Vicki is a Nationally Certified American Sign Language Interpreter, having earned a Bachelor's Degree in Educational Interpreting from the University of Arizona and a Master's Degree in Interpretation from Gallaudet University. Vicki has provided interpreting services in a wide variety of settings across the country over the past fifteen years, and is now the Community Outreach Coordinator for the Arizona Department of Emergency and Military Affairs (DEMA). Vicki's primary responsibility at DEMA is to run the Emergency Response Interpreter Credentialing (ERIC) program, a program which she co-founded in 2015. The ERIC program's mission is to ensure that accessible communication is provided to Deaf and hard-of-hearing citizens during Emergency and Disaster Response and Recovery efforts via trained and qualified ASL Interpreters and CART Captioners.

Short Bio: Mac Fulfer is an attorney who initially became interested in face reading for the purpose of jury selection. After years of practice and study he wrote *Amazing Face Reading*, a guide to reading faces. Mac's use of face reading has provided an amazing breakthrough in communication. He has presented over 1500 talks on face reading to Fortune 500 companies, the American Bar Association, meeting planners, doctors, psychologists, teachers, the military, social workers, auditors, human resource professionals and realtors to name just a few.
